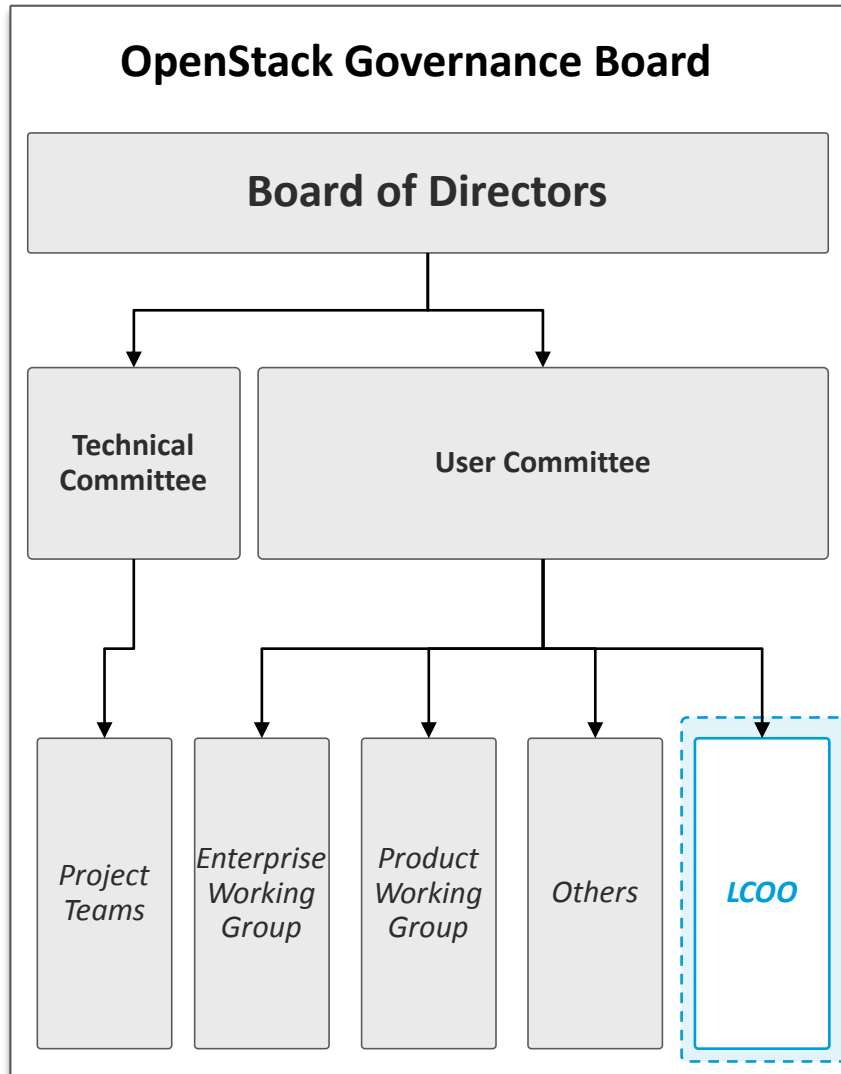

- Registering as a formal OpenStack “Working Group” is in Progress

Mission

OpenStack Community Contributors with a Shared Interest In:

- Accelerating the enterprise maturity and adoption of OpenStack
- Driving Community awareness of platform enhancements necessary to address the unique use cases of network service providers and horizontally scaling, massively distributed, cloud operators.

Key Tenets

Drive Community Roadmap Awareness:

Drive Community awareness of needs of Large Operators / Network Service Providers.

- Publishing use cases and Roadmap
- Contribute thought leadership to Working and User Groups

Drive Focused OpenStack Enhancements:

Transparently engage in continuous enhancement of the OpenStack platform.

- Coordinate development activities of its member’s
- Alignment with the spirit / goals of the OpenStack Foundation

Increase Upstream Contributions to OpenStack:

- Advance the OpenStack platform by a joint LCOO engineering team.
- Shared objectives along a number of vectors: Resiliency/Scale; Network / NFV; Operations; Workload Enablement; Multisite Federation; Bug Fixes & Code Reviews

Accelerate OpenStack Innovation:

- Promote greater opportunity for innovation, learning, mentoring and accomplishment.
- Engage more broadly and effectively within the community to raise awareness and accelerate improvement.

Membership

Minimum Criteria:

- Be a large Operator and/or Network Service Provider
- Participate equally with other members in the meetings and other activities of LCOO
- Be a contributor to the OpenStack platform with at least 4 dedicated FTE’s contributing
- Contribute a minimum of 2 FTE’s to upstream activities aligned to the LCOO roadmap

Guiding Principals

Align with the OpenStack Foundation:

- Work openly and transparently within established channels
- Communicate Roadmap through Enterprise, Product, and Operator Working groups
- Engages with the OpenStack Foundation Board, Technical Committee and User Committee to drive coordination across projects
- Works with certain groups outside of OpenStack such as OPNFV whose work has critical impacts on the platform

Contribute all Work Upstream:

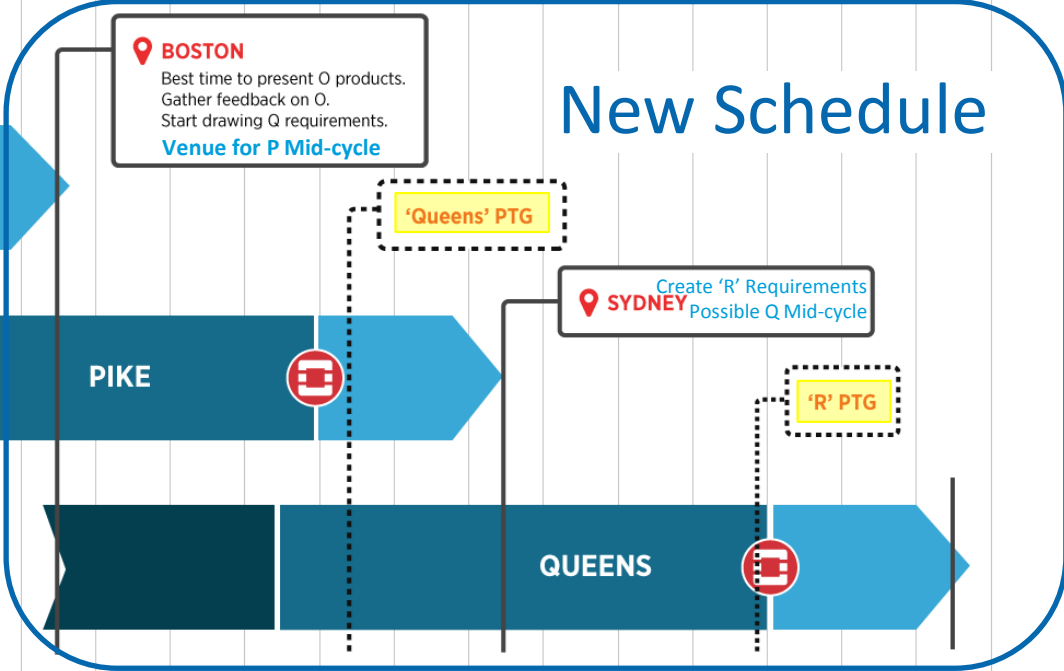
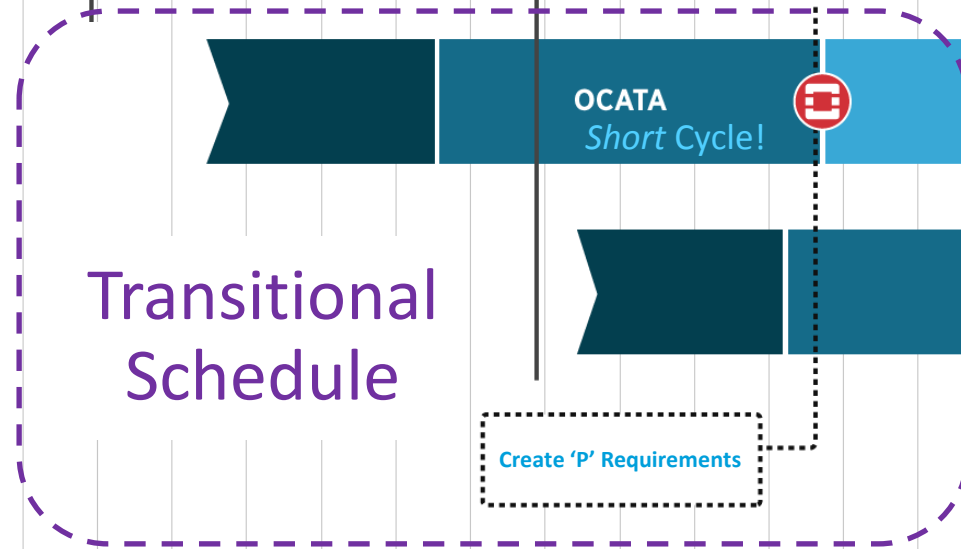
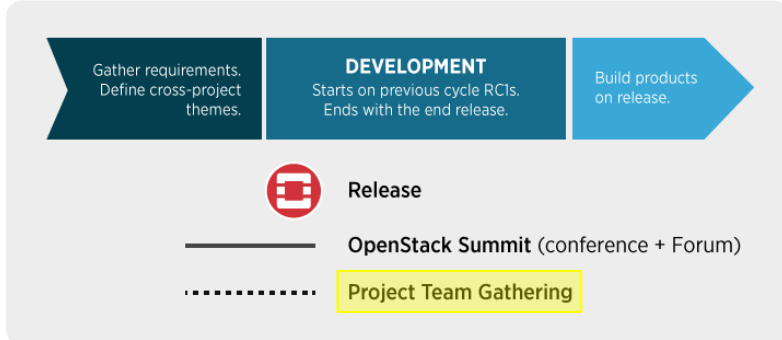
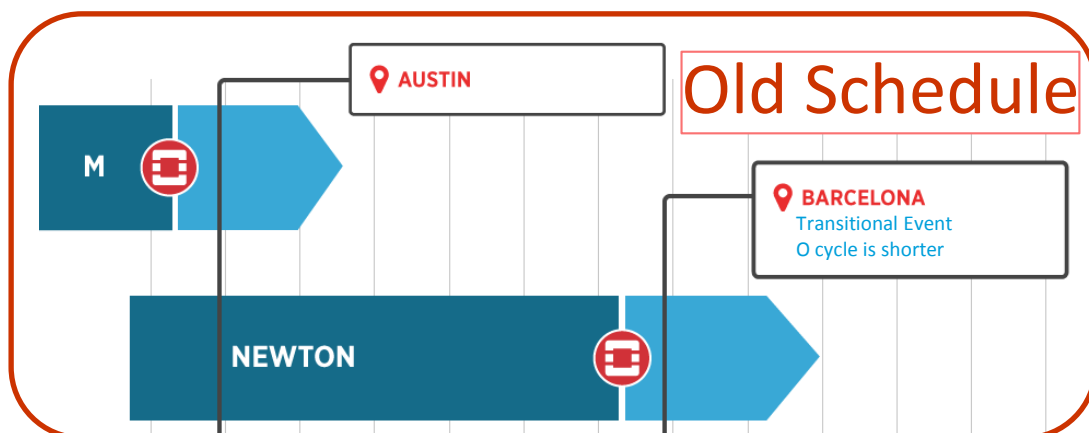
- Committed to furthering open standards and preventing vendor lock-in by ensuring that all work is contributed upstream.
- Work within the community to advance the platform for all

Governance

Governance Board:

- Equal representation from each of its member Companies
- Annually elected Chairperson from among its members
- Operates by consensus ; if consensus cannot be reached, Chairperson may call for a vote
- Meets quarterly to produce, prioritize and publish a common OpenStack Roadmap
- Meets quarterly to formulate Strategy for Roadmap delivery
- Collaborates to drive Community awareness and acceptance of its Roadmap objectives
- Directs member resources to collaborative upstream activities in alignment with Roadmap and Strategy
- Coordinates engagement with the OpenStack Foundation Board, Technical Committee and User Committee
- Coordinates member participation in Working Groups
- Meets monthly to re-align on Strategy execution, review progress and (re)direct activities as needed
- Meeting agenda’s published ahead of time for board meetings and meeting results published and open for all (members and non-members) to view
